

Martin Suuberg was appointed on January 8, 2015 as the Commissioner of the Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection by Governor Charles D. Baker and his Secretary of Energy and Environmental Affairs, Matthew A. Beaton. Prior to his appointment as Commissioner, Suuberg served as Undersecretary for Environmental Affairs in the Executive Office of Energy and Environmental Affairs. At MassDEP, he served as Deputy Commissioner for Policy and Planning. He took over this position after 9 ½ years as the Regional Director for the Central Regional Office in Worcester, MA. Over his long career, Suuberg served as General Counsel to MassDEP and to the Executive Office of Environmental Affairs, as well as to the former Department of Environmental Management, where he also served as Deputy Commissioner. Before moving to Massachusetts, he was an Associate Solicitor and then Deputy Solicitor at the U.S. Department of the Interior in Washington, DC, where he worked on land management and natural resource issues.
